

OUR FACULTY WRITES. . .

ON PARSHAT EKEV

(Oops. We apologize. A D'var Torah on this week's Parsha appeared last week.)

At the end of last week's Parsha, the Torah commands us ..l'ahavah et Hashem... v'davkah bo - to love Hash em and to cling to Him. Rashi (quoting the Gemara) asks how is it possible to cling to Hashem who is compared to an All Consuming Fire. The answer given is that one who associates with talmeidei Chachomim is considered to have associated with Hakodosh Boruch Hu.

There may be another way to understand this Posuk. Recently at a gathering of Machon and staff, someone related an insight that he had heard many years ago from Mr. Abraham Carmel, z"l. Mr. Carmel was a Roman Catholic priest who eventually converted to Judaism and became a ger tzedek. When asked what attracted him to Yahadut he responded that it was the framework of Halacha establishing a "24 hours a day" relationship with G-d. This is the idea of U'ladavkah bo"- a constant awareness of Hashem's presence and the individual's ability to relate to Him on a personal level.

As Mr. Carmel understood so well, u'ladavkah bo is not only a demand. It is
also the granting of a wonderful opportunity
given to no other people on earth- to establish an intimate relationship with the Ribbono Shel Olam.

A D'VAR TORAH ON

PARSHAT R'EH

The last topic discussed in this week's Parsha of Re'eh is that of the Sholosh Regolim, the three pilgrimage festivals of Pesach, Shevuos, and Sukkos. In the final two posukim of the parsha, after detailing certain particulars about each yom tov, the Torah makes a general statement. The accepted English translation of the Posukim tells us that all Jewish males are required to appear before Hashem in a place chosen by Hashem on each of the three regalim. We cannot come before Hashem empty-handed, but we must give as much as we can in accordance with the bracha that Hashem has given us.

The first perek of Mesechet Chagiga helps us to understand those posukim. The Gemara derives that all "free" Jewish men are required to bring two korbonot every Yom Tov, Olos r'eah and Shlomai Chagiga. The first Mishneh states the m inimum requirements for each korban, one being one portion of silver, the other being two, and a machlokes between Hillel and Shammai exists as to which is which. A later Mishneh tells us what the other requirements of the korbonot are. The Tannah states that someone with a large family and little money brings many shlaymim and few olos, while someone in the opposite situation brings many olos and few shlaymim. About so meone who has a small family and little money the aforementioned minimum requirements are learned. As for one possessing a large family and abundant means, the posuk says, "Every men as he is able according to the b'racha given him by Hashem.

As the time of **Bias goale Tzedek** comes closer every day, learning these Halachot becomes stedily more important. Im Yertza Hashem may we be able to put the words of **Mesechet Chagiga** to use in the third Beit Hamikobsh in Yerushalayim.



SCHACTER, ROSMAN, AND YUDIN TAKE TOP HONORS, STAFF BASKETBALL TEAMS FINISH WELL

Last Wednesday, 13 campers journeyed after breakfast to Camp Lavi to compete in the Lavi invitational tennis tournament. The tournament involved four camps: Morash, Lavi, Raleigh, and B'nai B'rith. There were nine categories of competition including 16 and under singles, 16 and under doubles, 14 and under singles, and 14 and under doubles for both boys and girls. There was also a 12 and under singles for boys.

Jon Schachter and Yechiel Rosman emerged as champions in the 16 and under doubles category. In their first match versus Lavi, Schachter and Rosman found themselves behind 4-3. They rallied, however, due to awesome net play by Rosman and excellent volleying by Schachter. The duo proceeded to win the next three games and the match 6-4. In the finals, the two started to coast as they opened up a 5-0 margin over Camp Raleigh. Things started to come apart, however, as suddenly the gap was cut to 5-4. 

In the finals Yudin was matched against a 12 year old from Bnai Brith who was supposed to be an unbeatable tennis player. Yudin, however, humbled the Bnai Brith opponent quite quickly. Despite dropping the first two games, Yudin won the championship 8-3.

The team of the year in Camp Morasha was clearly the Lady Machine who finished the season 5-1. This week they walloped Mesorah, Lavi, and Raleigh in succession— each by a margin greater than 15 points. Against Mesorah, Sheera Epstein exploded in the 3rd quarter to help the Lady Machine coast to a 49-32 victory. This game was really close the entire way through as the Morasha Machine led by 2 after the first quarter and trailed by one at the half. In the second half, Morasha opened up a 35-31 lead behind the powerful and fierce scoring of Jeff Morris. The Raleigh Rokachs, however, responded and after going on a 13-5 run, led 44-40. Israel Wallach followed with precise shooting to knot it at 44. Between this point and the middle of the 4th quarter, the game was always within 2. Jeremy Bandler and Israel Wallach continuously responded to each Raleigh basket with a fast break conversion. With only 1 minute remaining the score was knotted at 57 and Dov "Rock and Roll" Deutsch swished a 21 foot trifecta to make it 60-57 Morasha. On the ensuing Ral eigh possession, Shelly Rokach, captain of the Raleigh Rokachs, appeared to have an easy lay-up.
