Parshat Balak

PARSHAT BALAK CONCLUDES WITH ZIMRI, THE NASI OF SHIMON, ENGAGING IN AN ACT WHICH NOT ONLY CHALLENGED MOSHE'S PERSONAL HONOR, BUT ALL OF THE JEWISH IDEALS AS WELL PERSONAL WE ARE TOLD OF THE VARIOUS REACTIONS TO THIS HEINOUS ACT. WHILE PINCHAS RISES WITH ANGER AND PROCEEDS TO SPEAR AND KILL BOTH ZIMRI AND KAZBI, THE OTHER JEWS REVERT TO STAND AND CRY BY THE DOOR OF THE MISHKAN. A CURSORY READING OF THE TEXT REVEALS THAT PINCHAS WAS THE ONLY ONE WHO SUCCESSFULLY HANDLED THE SITUATION. IT SEEMS THAT THE OTHER JEWS WERE PARALYZED INTO INACTION, CHOOSING TEARS OVER SPEARS. CHAZAL, HOWEVER, COMMENT THAT THERE WAS FAR MORE THAN PARALYSIS INCLUDED IN THE JEWS' TEARS. THE TALMUD IN SANHEDRIN 82A RELATES HOW THE JEWS WERE CRYING BECAUSE MOSHE FORGOT A HALACHA. OTHER COMMENTARIES UNDERSTOOD THIS CRYING AS A FORM OF TEFILLA OR RECITING KRIAT SHMA (SEE TARGUM YONATAN OR IBN EZRA). WE MUST ASK OURSELVES WHY THE JEWS REACTED IN THIS PECULIAR FASHION. WHY WOULD THEY SUBSTITUTETEARS FOR FORGOTTEN TORAH AND PRAYERS FOR MILITANCE AND ACTIVISM? THE TRUE ACTIVIST, THE PINCHAS, WHO CAN TAKE HOLD OF A TENSE AND DIFFICULT SITUATION TO BRING IT TO A SUCCESSFUL END IS VERY RARE. FOR MOST PEOPLE HANDLING A DIFFICULT SITUATION MEANS NOT BEING DRAWN IN, THUS, IN AN EFFORT TO PROTECT THEMSELVES, THE JEWS TURNED INWARDS AND REAFFIRMED THEIR COMMITMENT TO HASHEM, THEY ALSO SOUGHT THE POSSIBLE CAUSES OF THEIR PREDICAMENT AND EVENTUALLY ATTRIBUTED IT TO MOSHE'S FORGETTING OF A HALACHA, A PART OF THE TORAH WHICH IS THE VERY LIFE OF THE JEW. ALSO OFTEN ENCOUNTER DIFFICULT SITUATIONS IN OUR OWN LIFE, SITUATIONS WHICH CHALLENGE THE VERY IDEALS WE BELIEVE IN. VERY FEW OF US POSSESS THE QUALITES OF PINCHAS. WE ARE INCAPABLE OF ACTING DECISIVELY AND HANDLING THESE DIFFICULT SITUATIONS. THUS, IT WOULD SEEM LOGICAL THAT CHALLENGES CONFRONT INTROSPECTION AND REAFFIRMATION OF FAITH

THAT THE JEWS DISPLAYED.

The third to last possuk in the torah reads "V'Lo Kam Navi Od B'Yisroal K'Moshe" There never arose again a navi in Bnei , Yisroel like Moshe. On this possuk the Sifri comments that amongst the govim there did arise a navi like Moshe Bilaam. This idea is a difficult one to grasp. How can Sifri equate Moshe with Bilaam? Moshe was one of the greatest men who ever lived and Bilaam was one of the biggest Rishaaim. What is the meaning of this statement? The answer to this question can be obtained when analyzing a Gemara Baba Basra Daf 14. The Gemara teaches that Moshe wrote Sifro his sefer refering to the 5 books of the Torah. Parshas Bilaam and Parshas Iyov. The obvious question is why does the Gemara need to say that Moshe wrote Parshas Bilaam? Isn't that included in the Gemara's first statement that Moshe wrote the whole Torah? Explaining Ray Shach, Shlita, in the name of the Maharal M' Diskin that one might have made the mistake of assuming that Moshe wrote Parshas Bilaam. The reason for this worry, as the Maharal M'Diskin explained is that Moshe and Bilaam were unalike any other navi .When all other navim recieved nevuah the nevuah was not clear. The navi had to filter the nevuah through his neshama and interpret it to discover what it meant. However Moshe received a unique type of Nevua אספקלריא מאירה. Moreover Moshe recieved all the navuos in the torah that any biblical figure received, each time with אספקלריא מאירה Because he received all the Navuous so clearly, he was the one to record them. However, Bilaam also received this unique Navuah. Since Hashem knew that Bilaam was so evil and therefore if Bilaam would receive the normal unclear navuah that Bilaam would naturally interpret it for the bad, Hashem gave Bilaam the navua האירה מאירה. Therefore, Bilaam ended up blessing Bnei Yisroel instead of cursing them. Says the Maharil M'Diskin, this idea is why the Gemara had to specify that Moshe wrote Parshas Bilaam. Otherwiseone might think Bilaam wrote it because Bilaam got clear navuah. This idea also explains the aforementioned Sifri Moshe and Bilaam were alike in that they both received אספקלריא מאירה. However they certainly were not on the same spiritual level.


