PARSHAT V'ETCHANAN

In Hallel we declare שמים שמים לה' והארץ נתן לבני אדם (The heavens are Hashem's and he has given the Earth to man). The Kotzker Rebbe said that Hashem gave the Earth to man so that he can make a heaven of the Earth. How can we do that? The best way is found in ברכה אחרונה. We ask Hashem to eat from the blessings of Eretz Yisrael (לאכול מפריה) and rebuild Yerushalayim. It would be enough just to ask for rebuilding Yerushalayim, but Hashem gave us Brachot in Eretz Yisrael to increase our Yirat Shamayim and Avodat Hashem.

Parashat ואתחנן begins with Moshe Rabbeinu davening to Hashem to go into Eretz Yisrael. The Gemorah asks, "Why did Moshe desire to go into Eretz Yisrael. Did he need to eat its fruits (לאכול מפריה)? Did he need to be satiated by its goodness (לשבוע מטובה)?" The Gemarah answers, "No. Moshe said, 'There are many important mitzvot that can only be done in Eretz Yisrael. I want to fulfill all the mitzvot". The Ktav Sofer questions why the Gemarah asks if Moshe Rabbeinu needed to eat the fruit or if he wanted to eat the fruit. He answers with the Rambam who explains that living in Eretz Yisrael with all its brachot helps us in our Yirat Shamayim and Avodat Hashem. Moshe Rabbeinu was on the highest possible level of Yirat Shamayim and Avodat Hashem without living in Eretz Yisrael and eating its fruits. Therefore, the Gemarah asks; "Does Moshe need to go to Eretz Yisrael and eat its fruits?" It answers, "No, he doesn't".

Where does a person's highest possible level of Yirat Shamayim and Avodat Hashem lead? The Ktav Sofer defines the טוב from from the phrase טוב לך בעולם הבא. A person with the highest possible level of Yirat Shamayim and Avodat Hashem will be satiated with the good of עולם הבא. We, who are not on Moshe Rabbeinu's level need to get to Eretz Yisrael to eat its fruits there to grow in Yirat Shamayim and Avodat Hashem to make a heaven of the Earth.
