sadim. The educational staff and the programming department have been working around the clock to incorporate the theme into your everyday schedule.



The camp then


made its way down to the Lake to watch an amazing fireworks presentation provided by Moshe Medetsky and his staff.




Younger Ilanot Boys

Alufim Boys



Dvar Torah By: Adam Hertzberg- BMP

"Moshe hit the rock"! This is the famous answer everyone gives when asked why Moshe was punished and not allowed in to Eretz Yisroel. This episode is brought in this week's *Parsha*.

After Miriam dies, *Bnei Yiroel* lose their water source of the *Be'er Miriam*. They complain to Moshe that they have no water. Moshe brings this problem before Hashem, to which Hashem tells him to "speak to the rock" in front of them and water will come forth. Moshe famously "hits the rock" and water comes forth from the rock. The next *pasuk* writes that Hashem tells Moshe that because he did this he will not merit to bring *Bnei Yisroel* into *Eretz Yisroel*.

So what?! So Moshe hit the rock, was this really such a bad thing?!?! Why, because of this, did Hashem not allow Moshe into *Eretz Yisroel*?

Rav Zelig Reuven Bengis, who was the Av Beis Din of Yerushalayim in the early 1900's comments on this pasuk that rally Moshe, was right to hit the rock! He learned from Avraham Avinu that water is to be given via a Shaliach (messenger). When the 3 angels came to Avraham he told them "yukach na meaat mayim", which does not mean "you shall take water", rather "water should be taken" via a messenger. Therefore if he spoke to the rock that would not have been Hashem giving Bnei Yiroel water via a Shaliach, rather directly, only through the mouth of Moshe. Moshe was therefore correct for hitting the rock, allowing the water to be given to Bnei Yisroel via a Shaliach. However, what was Moshe's mistake? He acted out of anger. Instead of finding a way to deliver the water to Bnei Yisroel as a Shaliach, he got frustrated and hit the rock out of anger ruining his act of Shlichut.

Why was Moshe punished, by not being allowed into Eretz Yisroel?

Entering into Eretz Yisroel was Bnei Yisroel's culmination of becoming "Am", a nation. Eretz Yisroel's nature is that of a home for Am Yisroel. Am Yisroel cannot be shalem, whole, if they are outside Eretz Yiroel. Only once Bnei Yisroel are together in Eretz Yisroel can they be called an "Am". It is for this reason that Hashem did not want Moshe to be the one to bring Bnei Yisroel into Eretz Yisroel. Hashem felt that because Moshe had this characteristic of anger he was not fit to be the person to transform Bnei Yisroel into Am Yisroel, by bringing them to Eretz Yisroel.

In these tough times in *Eretz Yisrael* we must unite ourselves and improve our *midot*, and ultimately be able to come together in *Eretz Yisrael*, *B'shalom*.




Yachad News
