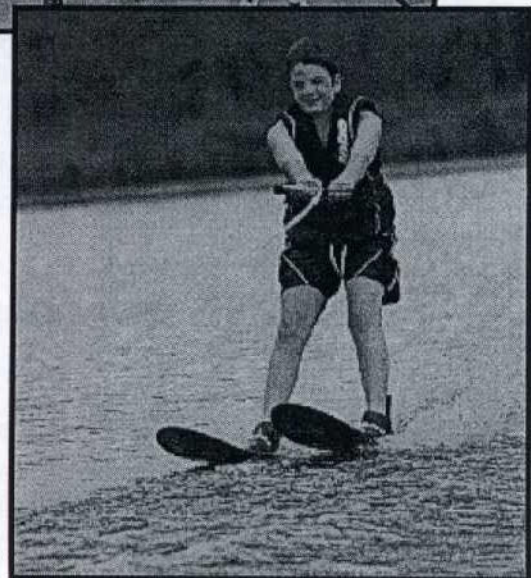

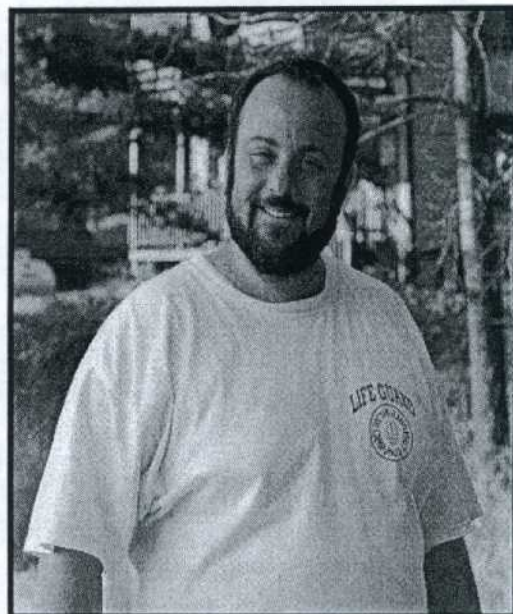


Dovy Klugerman A"H more than your usual camper

Camp Morasha commemorated Dovy's Shloshim this past Shabbos with special sichot, and shiurim in his name.

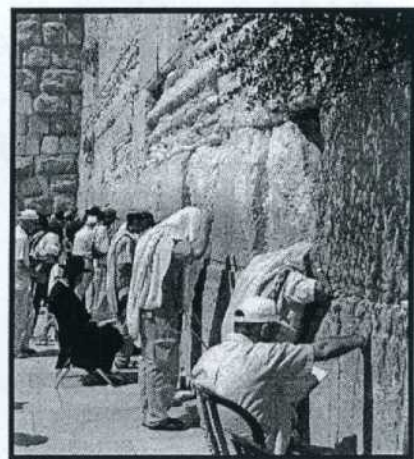


17th B'tamuz a day to remember

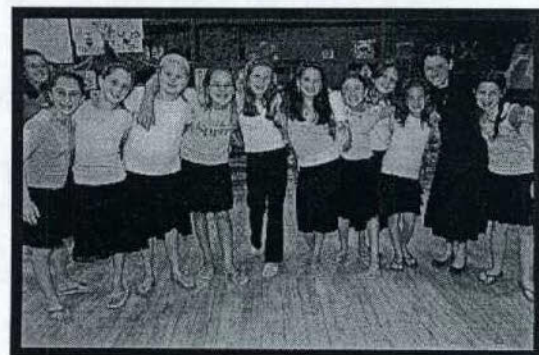

The Three Weeks in Camp Morasha

Do you remember how people felt on September 11, 2001. Do you understand how people feel now after the destruction of the World Trade Centers. Sad? Angry? Fearful? Uncertain?

Can you imagine what it would be like if you came home from camp and your house wasn't there? If nobody would take you in and you just roamed the streets with no place to go?

Well, take these feelings and multiply them by a gizzillion and that's what the Jewish people felt when the Bet HaMikdash was destroyed. When we went into galut. When we no longer had the Shechinah as part of our day to day lives.

I don't want to scare anyone. Baruch Hashem, this galut is now much better in many ways. We are relatively safe and comfortable and have more than we could ask for. But we have to remember that life is not as it should be. We should be in Eretz Yisrael. We should have a Bet HaMikdash. And then our lives would be...a gizzillion times... better. We'd be closer to Hashem.

So we have the "Three Weeks" and the "Nine Days" and "Shavu'a she-chal bo" and "Tisha B'Av" to help remind us about what we don't have. To make us stop and really think about what was and what could be and what should be.

So during the Three Weeks we don't have weddings and celebrations and we don't cut our hair. For those of us who have lost close relatives and have been in aveilut (mourning) this reminds us of some of the things that we couldn't do when mourning a close relative. In Camp Morasha, during the Three Weeks all activities proceed as normal, except no celebratory music and dancing. This includes music with instruments for the purpose of celebrating an event. It does not include the day to day singing or dance activities that are a regular part of the camp schedule. It does not include listening to music in the bunk or appropriate movies. NO haircuts. Shaving as is customary (some refrain from shaving

during this entire period, others from Rosh Chodesh on. Many shave erev Shabbat, others do not.)

And then it gets more intense, during the Nine Days:

Swimming and Showering: The prohibition of bathing is a prohibition of bathing for pleasure. Therefore, showering to remove dirt, odor and sweat is permissible (preferably with cold or tepid water). Swimming for pleasure is prohibited, but swimming for instruction or for exercise is permitted. If the weather is exceptionally hot and exceedingly uncomfortable, bathing or swimming to cool off is permitted as well.

Other Lake Activities: Water skiing, tubing and the Iceberg are prohibited throughout the nine days. Row boating, canoeing and kayaking are prohibited only during shavu'a she-chal bo. **Other Activities:** As Rock Climbing and Horseback Riding are not particularly dangerous, they are permitted during the Nine Days.

Music: Music is prohibited during this period, with the exception of educational or religiously inspiring events. Dancing for instruction or exercise is permitted.



Laundry: In general, doing laundry is prohibited during the nine days. However, if we refrain from doing laundry and the campers will not have clean clothes to wear, we consider this as "one who only has one garment" and we are lenient. For health reasons, all undergarments may be laundered. Outer garments may be laundered as required, especially those worn for Shabbat. Since our method of laundering differs from that discussed in the Talmud, freshly laundered garments may be worn the entire week.

Eating Meat: Eating meat and drinking wine is prohibited, except for a Seudat Mitzvah, including Shabbat and a Siyum.

Let's pray that this is the last Tisha B'Av that we have to observe and NEXT YEAR we are all in YERUSHALYIM!

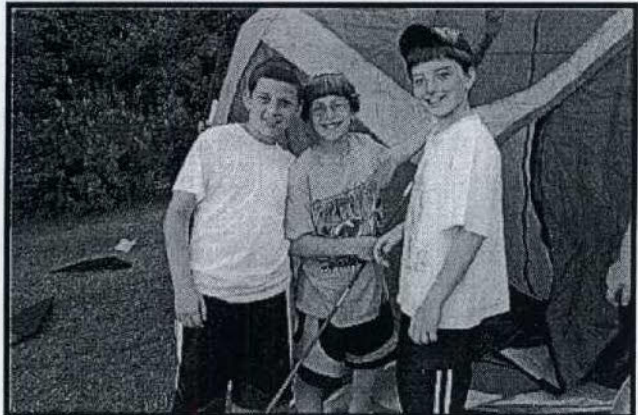
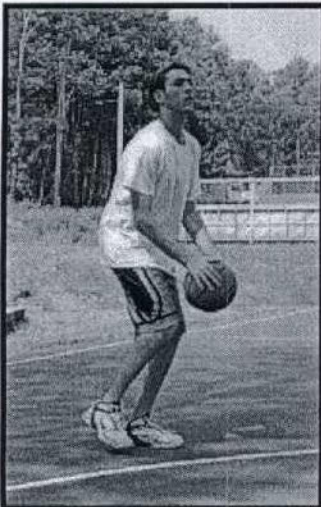
Younger Ilanot Boys

Dvar Torah

The first Rashi in this week's Parsha deals with the question of why Pinchas's full lineage is given when Hashem tells Moshe that as a reward for killing Kozbi and Zimri, Pinchas will receive Bris Kehunas Olam and Bris Shalom. Rashi, quoting the Medresh, answers that people would protest that "this grandson of someone who had fattened calves to be sacrificed to idols (Yisroel) killed a prince in Israel (Zimri was a Nasi Beis Av for Shimon)? Therefore, G-d called him a descendant of Aharon. This answer is very difficult to understand. First of all, what does the fact that Pinchas was the grandson of a person who fattened cows for idol worshipping have anything to do with Pinchas's actions now? Second of all, how does the fact that Pinchas was a descendant of Aharon Hakohen refute the claim of the people? Rav Reuven Taragin, Ram in Yeshivat Hakotel, explains that the people's problem with Pinchas's action was that it wasn't done for the right reason and that it wasn't done "lishma". Pinchas was merely following in the footsteps of his grandfather Yisroel. Just as Yisroel fattened cows to serve idols in order to stand out and grab attention for himself, Pinchas killed Zimri in order to stand out and bring attention to himself. Whether people are serving idols or serving Hashem it was in Pinchas's character to stand out and take it a step farther than everyone else. Pinchas was simply doing something that was in his nature, namely, trying to show off. To answer this claim, Pinchas's full lineage is given. Aharon Hakohen was known as a rodeph shalom. For this reason **all** of Klal Yisroel cried when Aharon passed away, as he spread peace to all the people. Pinchas was a descendant of Aharon. Therefore, for Pinchas to kill Zimri was completely against Pinchas's nature, which was peace. It was not something that was done in order to stand out, like what Yisroel did when he fattened cows to serve idols. The action was done completely for the sake of Hashem and was "lishma."

Girl's BMP (AKA GMP)

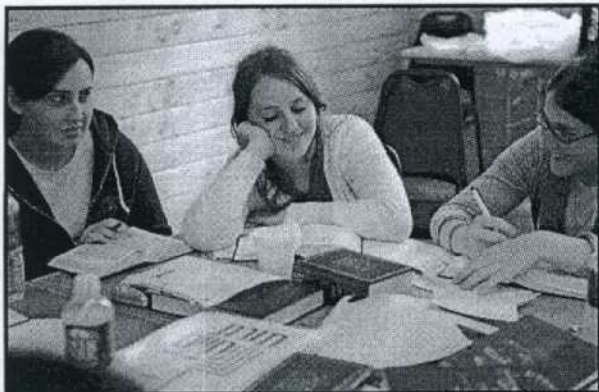

On boys campus we swim with our own lifeguard and a partner we are having great fun!!

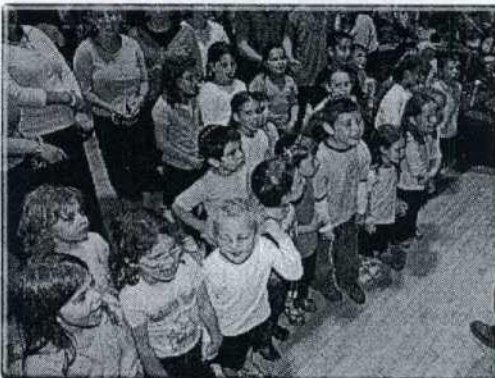
