

Torah Thoughts

Did you ever wonder why there are three different Shemoneh Esrehs for Shabos davenings and only one type of Shemoneh Esrehs for weekday davenings?

The Netivot Shalom answers this question by explaining that the three parts of Shaboss correspond to the three parts of a Jewish marriage process. On Friday night we greet Shaboss and set it aside as a holy time, corresponding to the act of Kedushin when a husband sets apart his wife from all other women and designates her as "his". This is reflected by the words "Atah Kidashta" that we say in Maariv. On Shabos day we have the opportunity to take pleasure in a special relationship with Hashem through davening, eating and zmirot, corresponding to the Chupa when the husband and wife enjoy time together under a covering which symbolizes Hashem's presence. This is reflected by the words "Yismach Moshe" that we say in Shacharit which speaks of Moshe's joy in receiving the mitzvah of Shaboss. Finally, on Shaboss afternoon we achieve the ultimate and most intimate part of our relationship with Hashem, corresponding to Yichud when husband and wife begin to live together as a couple. This is reflected by the words "Atah Echad" where we designate Hashem as the one and only whom we have a relationship with. Be'ezrat Hashem our teffilot this Shaboss will be enhanced by a deeper understanding of the words we say when connecting to Hashem on this holy day.






