ON THE PARSHA

Nepotism and Morasha

Many things in our tradition and community are acquired by family relations. The role of the kohen, for example, is a position that is passed on from father to son. Similarly, when Aharon died in last week's parsha, he transferred to role of kohen gadol to his son, Elazar. However, in this week's parsha, we see a deviation from this practice.

The Jewish people stand on the border of the Promised Land and Moshe's life is about to end. We know that Moshe was very disappointed about his inability to see the culmination of his life's work, for he will not enter into Israel. Moreover, the midrash tells us, he had hoped that at least his children take over his role. However, God told him that even this would not happen, and Yehoshua would be his successor. While this was difficult for Moshe, he did not hesitate to follow

his orders and appoint Yehoshua, in order to convey a very important

message:

Even though there are some things that you have to be "born into", the ultimate role in Jewish life is not inherited, but is earned. Moshe earned it, and Yehoshua did too.

Morasha is our name, not Yerusha. Pirkei Avot encourages us to be diligent with Torah learning, because it is <u>not</u> a yerusha. A yerusha is an inheritance that one gets automatically, without doing anything. A morasha is a legacy; it is a heritage. It is an opportunity to get something special, but it is only acquired if we earn it. The main role of Jewish leadership was not inherited; Torah knowledge, the most precious treasure in our religion, in not inherited.

So let's live up to our name and take ownership over our Morasha!
