DVAR TORAH from MORAH NILI TURETSKY

Parshat Matot: Guard Your Tongue

In this week's parsha, the Torah teaches us that a person can create new realities with his speech with a Neder. By making a Neder, new prohibitions can be created, something which Halacha takes very seriously.

The Perek is introduced with the expression "zeh hadavar asher tziva Hashem" - "this is the thing that Hashem commanded." Rashi cites the Midrash which learns certain laws pertaining to vows and oaths from the use of this expression. Rashi adds that this expression also defines the unique quality of Moshe's prophecy, known as "aspaklaria hame'ira" - "the clear lens." All other prophets begin their prophecies with the expression "ko amar Hashem" - "so says Hashem," which denotes a lower level of Nevuah, "aspaklaria she'eina me'ira" - "an unclear lens". However, Moshe's prophecies begin with "zeh hadavar" - "this is the thing" which denotes clarity of transmission. Why is this unique aspect of Moshe's prophecy taught through the use of the same expression that introduces the laws of vows?

When a person makes a Neder, they use their faculty of speech, which was given to man by Hashem's own essence. When Moshe prophecied, it emanated directly from Hashem. This connection allowed for a clarity in Nevuah. We all possess this same Divine connection through our speech. During these three weeks, we should try to use our speech for only good and elevated purposes.

BOYS BMP by Yechiel Schwab and Shlomo Friedman: This week at the BMP started with an awesome Friday night tisch, as over 150 campers packed into the BMP and surrounding lawn, to eat cholent and learn. Sunday was great, as the parents came to camp to pay, I mean meet the waiters and RCs. Sunday night's G-Squared started off great, but as the divisions got older, the campers did steadily worse at Jewpardy. Monday was very exciting as BBYO, a pluralistic camp, visited the BMP.
