
NEWS FROM BOYS CAMPUS

Then the Alufim went to Nesher, to play tennis for Yom Nate,


Whoops! Did I say Alufim, I meant B20 because they're great.

Dvar Torah from Rabbí Matan Wexler Parshat Pínchas

A fascinating debate among the sages of the Talmud is mentioned in the introduction to the Sefer Ein Yaakov. Various opinions are offered as to what should be regarded as the most important pasuk in the Torah. Some of the more obvious pesukim that come to mind, such as Shema Yisrael and Ve'ahavta Le'rayacha Kamocha - Love your neighbor like yourself, are suggested. However, there is one verse championed by one of the rabbis that seems strange. He suggests that the pasuk that highlights the twice-daily Korban Tamid, found in Parshat Pinchas, is of utmost importance. Why?

Last Sunday, we began to observe the mourning period of the Three Weeks by abstaining from food and drink due to a number of calamities that befell our people on the 17th day of Tammuz. One of the lesser-known tragedies that occurred on this date was the cessation of the Korban Tamid, the sacrifice offered each morning and afternoon without fail. Our rabbis determined that we must fast to commemorate this terrible event. Why? It's true that even Cal Ripken's consecutive games record doesn't compare to the well over 200,000 straight days that this sacrifice was offered. But, is it really that big of a deal that the Jewish People should fast?

Perhaps, the importance of the Korban Tamid to the Jewish People and its prominence in the Torah is found in the word, "tamid", which means constant. The Korban Tamid serves as a sign of the constant devotion of the Jewish People to Hashem and His Torah. Judaism is not just a religion where a person prays three-times-a-day and fulfills mitzvot throughout the day and week; it is a way of life. Just as a person's heart constantly beats, so too a Jew needs to constantly and consistently live a Jewish way of life. This is the lesson that the Korban Tamid teaches us. It is such an important one that one rabbi ranked the verse discussing the Korban Tamid as pasuk #1 and a major reason for the fast of the 17th day of Tammuz!

In Camp Morasha, we are members of a community whose Torah values and Jewish lifestyle permeate our camp experience. Throughout most of the year, our parents and teachers strive to instill within us middot tovot and Jewish ideals. Now, during the summer, we have the opportunity to show Hashem, our families, and ourselves that we constantly carry with us our Jewish heritage and middot tovot that they taught us.
