At the end of Parashas Matos, the tribes of Reuven and Gad request to remain on the Eastern side of the Yarden, with all of their cattle, while the rest of Bnai Yisrael prepare to cross into Eretz Yisrael. When Moshe grants their request, he commands half of the tribe of Menashe to remain there with the two other tribes, even though Menashe had never requested this "favor." Why did Moshe want Menashe to stay with Reuven and Gad? And why divide them into two instead of keeping them together?

When we look back to the ancestry of the tribe of Menashe, and we remember Menashe the person, we can begin to realize what Moshe might have had in mind. Sefer Bereishit is filled with sibling rivalry - Kayin & Hevel, Yishmael & Yitzchak, Eisav & Yaakov, Yosef & his brothers. Yet there is one set of siblings who manage to overcome the jealousy and sibling rivalry, and manage to get along with one another - that is Menashe & Ephraim. Even though Menashe was the older brother, and deserved his grandfather's right hand during the giving of the beracha, still he managed to get along with, and be happy for his younger brother Ephraim. Menashe then represents the ability to be happy for someone else and maintain a harmonious relationship in the face of adversity.

This is exactly the tribe that Moshe wanted to put with Reuven and Gad on the other side of the Yarden.

Reuven and Gad were both the first born of their mothers (Leah and Zilpah), and neither one received any grand honor for being the Bechor. Moshe might have been nervous about these two tribes breaking away from the rest of the nation. So Moshe sent with them the one tribe which embodied unity and good will for others - the tribe of Menashe. Perhaps he divided Menashe in half in order to ensure they stay connected with their cousins on the other side of the Yarden, and by extension, with the rest of the nation.

What a great lesson for us to learn as we begin our summer together. Over the next several weeks together, we should try our best to be happy for our friends' successes and great moments. Instead of thinking "why wasn't I chosen?" or "why didn't I get a package?", let's try to cheer on our friends and do what Menashe would have done. After all, this is the glue which holds Klal Yisroel together.

A CHAT WITH DUCTIGAMIST, DR. CHAYE LAMM WARBURG

How long do you spend on Ductigami? All year! I search for interesting projects and articles, and then I save them in a file or Google Bar. Then, when it gets closer to the summer, I review my findings and decide which project is the best for the kids!

How did you get good at Ductigami? I know how to sew, so I thought I could attempt any craft, it was just a matter of learning. I'm self taught by learning off of the internet from sites like Pinterest, YouTube, iPad Books, and blogs.

What is your favorite thing to make? Bloomies "Little Brown Bags"

What is your favorite brand of duck tape? Duck brand for regular duck tape and Fortis for specialty types of tapes.

SOME DUCK TAPE FACTS

Duct tape was invented during WW ll because there was a need for a strong, flexible, durable, waterproof tape that could seal canisters, repair cracked windows, repair trucks and help the war effort in general.

Using medical tape as a base, they applied two new technologies: adhesives gave the tape its unshakable stick and polyethylene coating allowed them to laminate the tape to a cloth backing, making it extremely strong and flexible. The resulting tape was nicknamed "Duck Tape" for its ability to repel water, while ripping easily into strips for fast convenient use.

After the war the tape was put to the more civilian use of holding ducts together, so the product changed from a nameless army green tape to the familiar gray duct tape.

Thirty years later, the name was changed to Duck Tape by Jack Kahl, former CEO of Manco, Inc. who put 'Manco T. Duck' on the Duck Tape logo. Manco, Inc. also began to shrink-wrap and label the product, making it easier to stack for retailers, and easier to distinguish different grades for customers.

Now, over 50 years after its invention, Duck® tape is sold in more than 20 colors and is touted by its followers for having a nearly endless amount of uses.
