Parshat Devarim

This Shabbos we begin reading Sefer Devarim, which according to the Gemara in Avoda Zara is also called "Sefer HaYashar," the book of the upright, based on the Pasuk, "ViAsita HaYashar ViHatov" -- you should do the right and the good. This explanation seems to be problematic based on the fact that there also is a Pasuk in Sefer Shmot that states, "ViHaYashar Bi'Einav Yaaseh," so why isn't Sefer Shmot called 'Sefer HaYashar' as well? What is so special about the Pasuk in Devarim that makes it the nickname for this Sefer?

Rav Eliezer Rabinowitz explains that the Gemara, in many locations, uses our Pasuk of "ViAsita HaYashar ViHatov" as the source of our requirement to go above and beyond what is required of us by law. This Pasuk teaches us that in all areas of life, whether daily activities, or religious observance, Hashem wants to see that we go above and beyond what is technically expected of us.

As Tisha Ba'av approaches, we are fully aware that the Beit Hamikdash was destroyed because of 'Sinat Chinam,' baseless hatred. Rav Kook taught that the converse is true as well. The Beit

HaMikdash will only be rebuilt with 'Ahavas Chinam,' going above and beyond to show love to each and every Jew. As we begin Sefer Devarim and approach Tisha Ba'av, let us remind ourselves of this lesson. Whether it means going out of our way to pick up garbage around camp, or going out of our way to help a camper, let us turn Morasha into the "Yashar" camp.

Who's Who in Camp Morasha:

An Interview with Camp's Director of Photography, Shmuel Hoffman, and his wife Margalit!



WHERE ARE YOU FROM?

SH/MH: Now we live in Allentown, but I was born in Germany and made Aliyah for 6 years. We came to Allentown to be close to her parents.

WHERE DID YOU TWO MEET?

SH/MH: We met on sawyouatsinai.com and then met in Yerushalayim. We were married about 3, 4 months later and we have 3 kids, Baruch Hashem, 6, 5, and 4 years old.

HOW ARE YOU LIKING CAMP SO FAR?

SH: YES! It's great!

MH: Loving it! It's great not having to cook or do dishes! And the staff is so positive; it's really a great environment.

WHAT MADE YOU START FILMING?

SH: I had a passion for film making. I started doing this about seven years ago.

WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE MOVIE?

SH: Solaris by Andre Tarkovsky

MH: I like everything from Clueless to Dancer in the Dark.

WHAT DO YOU LOOK FOR IN YOUR WORK?

SH: In terms of composition, I look at a frame for content and try to find a stylistic approach or undertone/idea to support the content. The composition of my work is very content driven and I aim to elevate whatever the content may be by transcending the subject, say, by figuring out who a person is and expressing it through cinematography.

WHAT IS ONE OF YOUR MOST NOTABLE FILMS?

SH: I made a Jewish science fiction film about The Ark, the original Aron Hakodesh, it's location, and what it would mean to the world to find it. It has a Scientific and Torah background, but even though it is a "Jewish topic," it was portrayed in a very generalized manner. It actually won a Houston International Film Festival Prize!

WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE PROJECT THAT YOU HAVE WORKED ON?

SH: Either the OU promo with the iPad theme - that was a really cool way to modernize something that was perceived as outdated, or the book trailer I did. It was for Simon and Schuster and played on MTV, but we basically made a film trailer for the book!

MARGALIT, WHAT'S YOUR ROLE IN ALL THIS FILM MAKING?

MH: I guess you could say I'm "quality control." I think sometimes after looking at something continuously, its good to have another pair of eyes...So I tell him which part is good or which part needs fixing.


News from Boys Campus...
