You Can't Fight a "War" Without "Weapons"

The story is told (Sefer Chovos Ha'levavos) of a group of soldiers who encounter a saintly old man as they return triumphantly from the battlefield. With a most serious look on his face, he informs them that the battle is far from over and the next challenge awaits them. "Now that you have won the minor war, the time has come for each of you to prepare yourself for the true battle that lies ahead." Bewildered, they asked him for an explanation. The sagely fellow replied, "The true fight that every human being must endure is the struggle against our yetzer harah, our evil inclination. To win such a battle is to truly be a warrior."

In our parsha we are warned of the great danger of abandoning Torah. "Beware for yourselves, lest your heart be seduced and you will turn astray and you will serve other gods and prostrate yourselves to them" (11:16). Rashi comments, "Once a person parts from the Torah, he goes and attaches himself to idolatry." A scary

thought, but is it really true? Don't chazal us otherwise? In Meseches Shabbos (105b) we are told that the yetzer harah can only bring one to the ultimate sin of avodah zarah in gradual steps. If so, why does Rashi present the descent into the world of idolatry as occurring so suddenly?

Rav Elchonan Wasserman shared a very brilliant answer from his rebbe, the Chofetz Chaim. Imagine two opposing forces battling over a significant period of time. Each strikes at his opponent and the balance of power shifts back and forth. Even if one army gains the upper hand, it is still possible for the opposing army to fight back and recover from the initial setback. However, if one army captures the other army's weapons, leaving them with no means of continuing the fight, it is clear that the war is over.

The Chofetz Chaim explained that the same is true in the "fight" against our evil inclination. Even if we sometimes surrender to our desires and fail to serve ¬' as we should, there is always the possibility of returning to a proper service of ¬'. Always, that is, as long as our most powerful "weapon" against the yetzer harah, the Torah, is still intact. "I [Hashem] created the yetzer harah and I have created the Torah as its antidote" (Gemara Kiddushin 30b). However, if the yetzer harah has prevailed in stopping us from studying Hashem's Torah, our means of self defense is lost as is the battle at hand.

As we emerge from a week of Color "War," some as victors and others unashamed for having given it their all, let us remind ourselves of this important idea in the life of Torah true Jews. Let us proudly carry and protect our precious "weapon," the Torah, from falling into enemy hands. After all, the "big battle" still lies ahead...

WHAT DO YOU LOOK FOR WHEN AUDITIONING THE CAMPERS FOR ROLES IN YOUR PRODUCTIONS?


There's a lot that goes into my decision making process!
