Parshat HaShavuah

Parshat Re'eh

In פרשה of this week's שלישי, we are introduced to the idea of a false prophet. Although anyone familiar with even recent history knows that humanity has seen an inordinate number of false prophets and saviors throughout its existence, we still look cynically upon the individuals who were taken in by these charlatans. Surely we, who are wise to the ways of the world, would never be fooled into following such nonsense and would have remained true to ה' and His תורה. What could they have done to get the masses to follow their 'prophecies'.

The תורה tells that these tricksters might have been far more impressive than we'd thought.

And he gives "ונתן אליך אות או מופת" to you a sign or a wonder." These false prophets were actually able to produce miracles, as the Torah continues and says,

"ובא האות והמופת אשר דיבר אליך" - And the sign and/or wonder comes" (true)." Once this individual is able to demonstrate his supernatural abilities he has obtained instant credibility. His

next move is to command the people to follow in his

ways. "נלכה אחרי אלהים אחרים אשר" - "Let us go after other gods whom you have not known and serve them." Now, the false prophet's words are far more enticing. Surely had he not been sent by a true god he would not have the power to perform wonders and miracles. Certainly his claims must be correct as demonstrated by his immense power. However, ה' commands us not to listen to the words of this false prophet, "כי מנסה ה' אלוהיכם אתכם" לדעת הישכם אהבים את ה' אלקיכם בכל "לבבכם ובכל נפשכם" - "For ה' your God is testing you to know whether you love ה' your God with all your heart and all your soul."

We see that our loyalty to ה' is subject to an incredibly difficult test; we are supposed to trust in Him rather than follow someone who is gifted beyond the natural realm. How can we be expected to pass such a test? Perhaps the answer lies in the פסוקים that surround the פרשה of the false prophet. The פסוק before teaches us the prohibitions of תוסיף and בל adding to or subtracting from מצות. The פסוק that follows tells us to cling to God - ובו תדבק of מצוה by imitating His ways (see רש"י).

בל תוסיף and בל תגרע explained by a mashal of the Dubno Maggid. A man came to town and wanted to start a business. He began borrowing small items from the locals in order to stock his shelves, and when the time came to pay back these items he always gave back two items instead of the one he had borrowed. When questioned about this by the lender he would respond, "The item you loaned me gave birth to another, so they're really both yours." After this practice continued for a short time, the man developed a reputation and people flocked to him in order to lend

him items. One day he approached a wealthy man and asked to borrow a very expensive candelabra, and the wealthy man was only too happy to oblige. However, when the time came to return it, the borrower came to the wealthy man with a look of despair on his face. "I'm so sorry to tell you that your candelabra died," he told the lender. Upon being informed that this was impossible, the borrower responded, "Everyone was perfectly willing to believe me when I claimed that their items were able to give birth. They can certainly trust me now when I say that their items died

The idea of substituting our judgement for that of הקב"ה is a slippery slope. We might think ourselves capable of adding to ה' laws, but once we declare the תורה to be subject to our own whims and morals we can pick and choose the מצות at our own discretion, and God's will can become completely distorted. Thus, the מצות of תוסיף and בל are about surrendering our judgement to the will of the Almighty.

Similarly, the command to cling to God and imitate his ways will help shape our world view until it becomes synonymous with that of the תורה, and ultimately God Himself. Thus, we are given the formula that allows us to pass the test of the נביא שקר. We are charged to surrender ourselves completely to ה' and His תורה and absorb as much of its truth as we possibly can. Through this we can inoculate ourselves against the impressive allures of the false prophet. If we live the way ה' wants us to, and we absorb enough truth, then we will be able spot a false prophet from a mile away.

What kills kings, what makes mountains crumble, and makes all life come to an end?


