# Parshat HaShavua

The events surrounding this week's פרשה contain two very unique incidents. When פנחס committed his famous life-saving act of zealotry, he stopped a plague that had already taken 24,000 lives. It was an event beneficial to people of the time, and it teaches us a lesson for our period as well. However, one question that jumps out at us when we read about this incident is where was משה רבינו? Why didn't he take action the way פנחס did? Surely if it was a question of knowledge of the הלכה, משה was the greatest תורה scholar of all time. If it was a question of revelation, משה was the greatest נביא of all time. Why then, did he not take the appropriate action as his student פנחס did?

רש"י tells us that משה רבינו forgot the הלכה concerning this matter. He explains that surely משה did not lack the intensity or the gumption to act, for he stood up before the entire nation when it worshipped the עגל הזהב and smashed the לוחות. Rather, הקב"ה hid the הלכה from him so that פנחס could come and claim his portion in the תורה. פנחס approached משה and asked him, "Have you not taught us that in such a case a zealot can take action"? משה, who until this point had forgotten the הלכה now remembered it, and told פנחס, "He who reads the letter should be the messenger in carrying out its contents." Immediately פנחס set out to perform his מצוה.

Similarly, we find the incident with the בנות צלפחד whose great love for the land of Israel drove them to approach משה and request a portion in the land in place of their father's. משה, in his humility, did not even attempt to answer their question, but rather presented it to ה' and awaited

the answer. Here too, רש"י comments that the הלכה became hidden from משה because ה' wanted the daughters of צלפחד to be the ones who received credit for teaching these הלכות to בני ישראל. Due to their initiative and willingness to step outside their comfort zones for the sake of receiving a חלק in the Holy Land, they were rewarded for all time, becoming teachers of תורה to the entire Jewish population.

In both instances the הקב"ה prevented משה רבינו, the greatest teacher and scholar of all time, from being the one to transmit these הלכות because He wanted to leave the opportunity for others to do so. This concept is often referred to as "מקום הניחו לו," a place has been left open for him. Although we assume that the scholars of earlier generations were far greater than us, it should never prevent us from trying to master and add our original insights and perspectives to the תורה. Every Jew, no matter how gifted, scholarly or skilled, has something that only he or she can add to ה' 's תורה. The זוהר הקדוש tells us that there are 600,000 letters in the תורה, one for every Jew. This means to say that every Jew has a portion in the תורה that only he or she can 'write'. A תורה that's missing even one letter is unusable, and it is our job to make sure that our letter is filled in beautifully and brightly. Hopefully we can take the lesson of חלק and the בנות צלפחד and achieve our חלק in ספר תורה as slowly but surely, the תורה, תורה, עם ישראל is becomes filled with our letters.

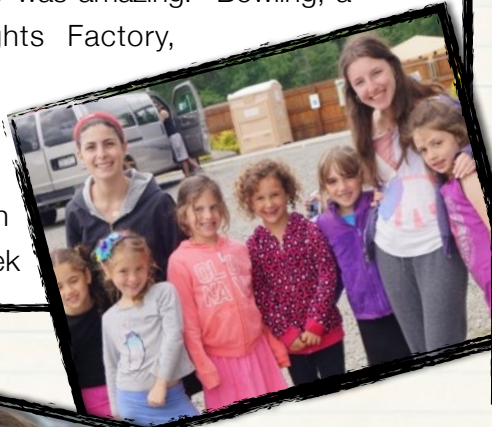
# In Other News...
