DVAR TORAH by Philly Korman:

וַיַּרָא בָּלָק בֶּן־צִפּוֹר אֵת כָּל־אֲשֶׁר־עָשָׂה יִשְׂרָאֵל לֱאֱמֹרִי וַיָּגָר מוֹאָב מִפְּנֵי הָעֶם מְאֹד

Balak ben Tzipor saw all that Israel had done to the Amorites. Mo'av became terrified of the nation [Israel].

Our commentators ask a question on these two pesukim: Doesn't everybody know what Israel had done to the Amorites? Why does the pasuk only say that Balak saw what they did?

The Sifsei Chachamim answer that the whole nation knew about Israel's success, but only Balak understood how this impacted the security of the people of Moav. Likutei Sichos explains this idea further by expounding on the words of Rashi. Rashi on the words "Balak saw" says: "If these two kings [Sichon and Og] in whom we placed our trust could not stand up to the Jewish people, then certainly we cannot." Here Rashi is referring back to an idea he told us about earlier in Parshas Chukas. In Chukas, Rashi explained that Sichon did not let the Jews cross through his land because the people of Canaan would pay him to protect them from invading nations, like a security guard. The people would pay Sichon and he would make sure that no unwanted people would enter the land.

The fact that the Canaanite people were paying Sichon for protection was not a known fact. We know this because if the Jews were asking Sichon if they could pass through his land, the question wouldn't have been so futile as "let us pass through your land." They would have used more force if they knew that Sichon was protecting the whole land of Canaan. Balak knew that Sichon was the "security guard" for Moav. So when Balak saw that their security was no longer a given (because their security guard was no longer there) he became alarmed and that is what caused the higher level of fear that the people experienced.
