

Who Creates Holiness? Dvar Torah by Yael Goldfischer

In Parshiot Matot-Masei we read about the interesting and puzzling request made by Reuven and Gad. They wish to live in the recently captured territories outside of Eretz Yisrael proper. At first Moshe is upset with their request and compares them to the meraglim of the previous generation, for they, too didn't want to live in the land of Israel. Moshe is worried that just like the meraglim led the nation to refuse the land of Israel, Reuven

and Gad's actions would create the same devastating results. Once Reuven and Gad explain that they are determined to help their brothers fight and settle the land of Israel, Moshe gives them Ever HaYarden to settle.

What happens to Ever HaYarden? Is it considered Israel or is it considered Chutz LaAretz? On the one hand, Moshe is upset with the request to live there and these tribes had to get special permission to make it their home, demonstrating that these lands are not considered Israel. Yet, on the other hand, the fact that they are given permission to live there may indicate that it is part of Israel. Some of the laws that pertain to the holiness of the land of Israel do take place in these lands. For example, these tribes are also given three refuge cities in their newly acquired lands. The status of refuge cities discussed in our parshiot might help clarify the confusing status of Ever HaYarden. The three cities of refuge established in Ever HaYarden are not effective until the cities of refuge in the land of Israel are established. This teaches us that Ever HaYarden only becomes an extension of Israel once the land of Israel proper is established as our homeland. Reuven and Gad at the moment are requesting land that is not Israel but, in a few short years, will become an extension of Israel, and that's why their request is met.

We can learn a very important lesson in religious growth from these tribes and their portion in Ever HaYarden. Kedusha, holiness, once created, can and should impact surrounding areas. We can, and should, positively impact those around us; whether it be by focusing more during tefilla, or learning during some down time or going out of our way to include others in a game or activity. With small actions we can all create holiness. All kedusha except for Kedushat Shabbat is created by people, by us. Hashem made Shabbat holy but all other holy items, places and times are made holy by Am Israel. We bring kedusha into time, location and actions. Together, we can all bring more holiness into our bunks, the courts, and our interpersonal relationships.
