Parsha Thoughts...tuvi tirschey (g15)

Two of the significant events in this week's Parsha are Miriam's death and the story of Moshe hitting the rock. Immediately after Miriam died there was no water for the Jewish people and they turned to Moshe to complain of thirst. In response to the people's complaints, Moshe turned to Hashem who instructed him to speak to the rock. He explained that when Moshe speaks to the rock, water will come from it and quench the thirst of the people. This is strange. What exactly did Hashem want Moshe to say to the rock and how could this interaction bring water to the Jewish people? The Netziv explains that Moshe was meant to speak words of Torah to the rock in front of the Jewish people. The words of Torah would bring forth the water. Hashem was trying to teach Moshe and Beni Yisroel that in times of need we should turn to Torah and Mitzvot for support. Chazal often compare the Torah to water and without water one would not survive. Just as one needs water to survive, the Jewish people need Torah to survive and thrive. In times of despair, we need to recognize that everything comes from Hashem, both our struggle and our salvation. We should therefore turn to the Torah, our life source, to provide us with the support we need to persevere.




