Parsha Thoughts...by Gavriel Katz (B19)

Time and again we find Mitzvot which are mentioned more than once. In fact if Hashem had mentioned each of the Mitzvot only once, the Torah would be far shorter. What we find is that every time a Mitzvah is repeated, the presentation is slightly different. There is what we call a 'Chiddush' - Something new. Something fresh to add a new dimension to the performance of that Mitzvah. A fine example of this is in the first two paragraphs of the Shema. In Parshat Va'etchanan we read the first and in the following week's Parsha, Parshat Eikev we read the second. We find that in these two Parshiot, various Mitzvot are repeated: to love Hashem, to study and to teach Torah, to wear Tefillin and the Mitzvah of Mezuzah. The chief Rabbi states that you will notice that there is a significant difference. The first paragraph of the Shema is in the singular. "V'Ahavta – You in your own personal capacity should love Hashem." "B'Shivtecha B'Veitecha – When you are in your home you should be studying and teaching Torah." "Al Mezuzot Beitecha – Upon the doorposts of your house you should have a Mezuzah." These same Mitzvot in the second paragraph of the Shema however, are all in the plural. The message is that we have a dual responsibility.
