PARSHA THOUGHTS Nina Siegel Alufot Chinuch Head

One of the most famous pesukim in the Torah, if not the most famous passuk in the Torah, is in this week's parsha - Shema! We're told "שְׁמַנוּ ה' אֱלֹקינוּ ה' אֱלֹקינוּ ה', that Hashem is our God and that Hashem is One.

When we think about what it means that "Hashem is One", Rav Yitzchak Hutner brings a beautiful insight. In his sefer Pachad Yitzchak Iggerot U'Ktavim (184-185), he answers a letter sent by his student that shared a difficulty he was having. His student shared that he felt that he was living a double life - he had his life in Yeshiva learning Torah and then his separate life working his job. Rav Hutner responded that having a career should not mean you have to live a double life. He brings a mashal: if you rent a room in a house and a hotel, you're living a double life because you have to switch between the two places, but if you rent a house with many rooms, you don't have to live a double life because when you switch rooms, you're still in the same house. He explains that we cannot view our connection to Hashem and Torah as a separate house from our job and what we are involved with in the world; rather, we must view everything we do as if "Tuah - one" and part of "Hashem's House".

This message is important as we're entering our last Shabbos at camp. Certain activities in camp feel like they're more obviously there to connect us to Hashem, like davening and shiur. Other activities, like swimming, sports, and arts, might not seem like they're so obviously connected. It's important for us to remember that everything we do, whether in camp or at home, are all "one" and part of Hashem's house. Hopefully over the course of the summer, we have begun to see Hashem more in everything we do, from eating in the dining room to winning points for our team in Morashia, and may we continue to see everything as part of us serving Hashem - "echad"!






