When the donkey miraculously speaks to Bilam, he says “Why have you hit me these three times”, it uses the term “shalosh regalim” to refer to these three times. Rashi there says that the donkey means to say, you are going to curse a nation who keeps the Shalosh Regalim??

What is the special Zechut of Shalosh Regalim that the donkey says you can’t conquer the people who keep it?

Rav Shwab explains that the Mitzvah of Aliyah lregel, going up to Yerushalayim on the Shalosh Regalim, is a Mitzvah of a journey, even if you don’t make it to your destination for some reason, you still get credit for your journey. The donkey is saying to Bilaam, right now you are on a journey to do something bad, even though you haven’t done it yet, and even though you won’t do it in the end, your walking, is to do something wrong. You, Bilaam are up against a people who journey toward doing the good, toward Hashem.

In Pirkei Avos, Avraham and Bilaam are compared to each other. It is so interesting to think that both Avraham and Bilaam go out on a journey and don’t end up doing what they had planned to do, but the difference is what their goal was while they were traveling; Avraham was going to do Hashem’s will, while Bilaam was not. In Judaism we don’t believe that it is all about the end result, if you are going in the right direction and are trying to get closer to Hashem, that is considered to be very valuable.

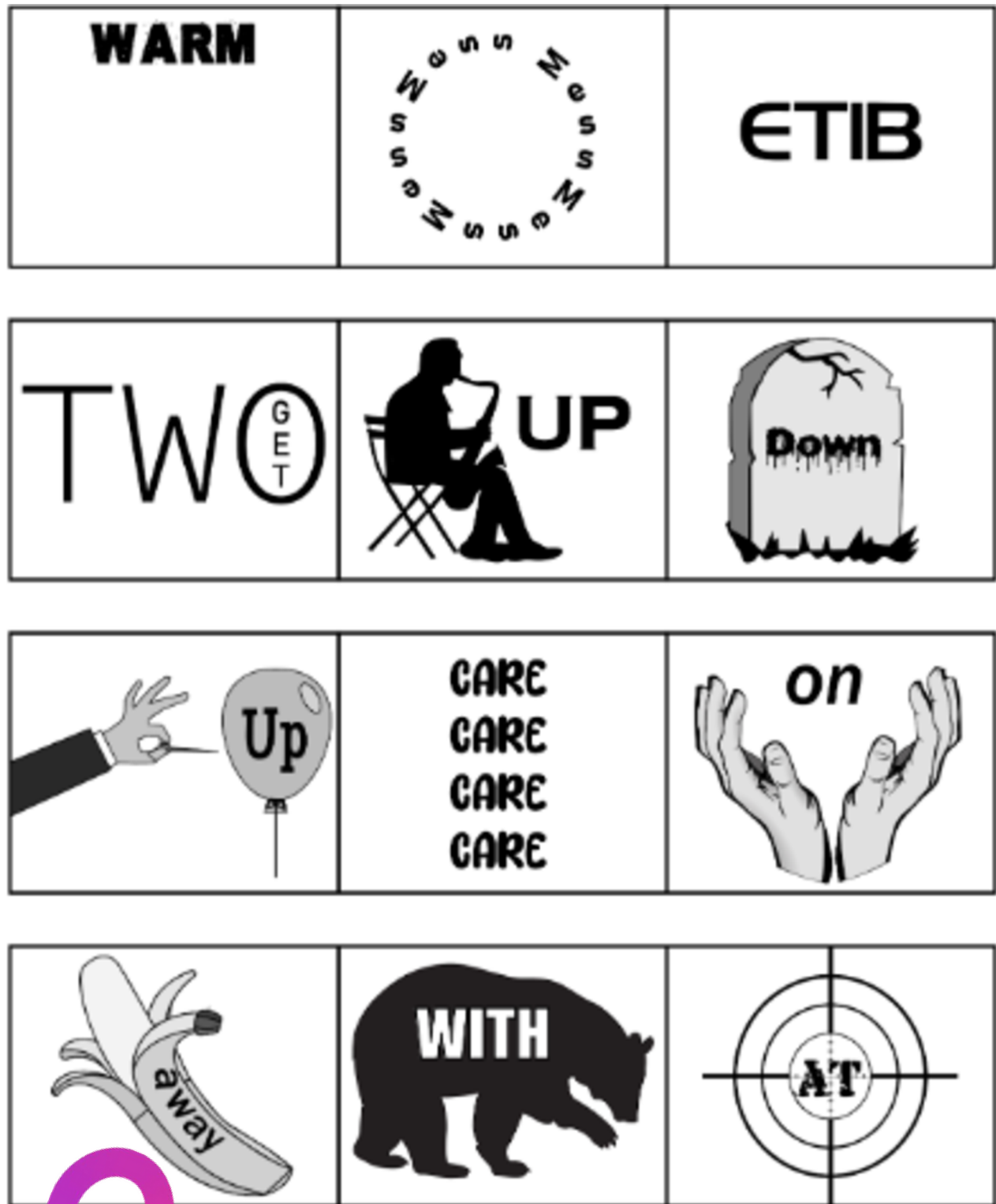

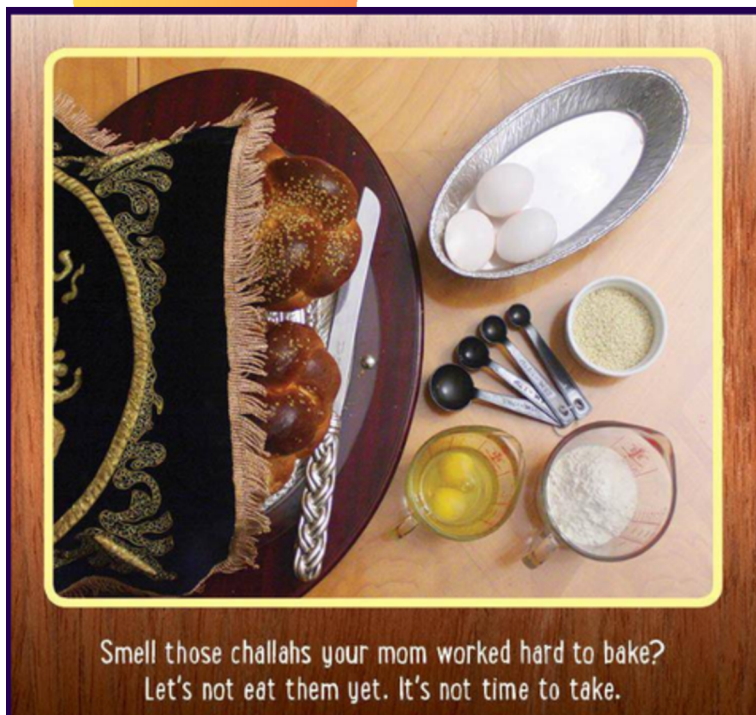
