PARASHA THOUGHTS

The phrase אָהַבְּתָּ לְרֵעֲךְ כָּמוֹךְ is one that is known by every child, well before they are even Bar or Bat Mitzvah. This phrase comes from Sefer Vayikra where the pasuk says, לא־תִקֹם וְלֹא־תִטֹר אֶת־בְּנֵי עַמֶּךְ אָהַבְתָּ לְרֵעֲךְ כָּמוֹךְ אֲנִי ה׳:

"You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against members of your people. Love your fellow [Israelite] as yourself: I am Hashem."

Many mefarshim wonder about the connection between the beginning and end of the pasuk. What does not bearing a grudge have to do with loving your fellow like yourself?

If we examine other mitzvos that are between a person and their fellow Jew, many if not all of those mitzvos make logical sense. For example, it makes a lot of sense to have laws about not killing or stealing, as these laws allow us to live in a just and moral society. That being said, the Shadal makes a comment on this pasuk that the only law that does not seem "fair" when it comes to mitzvos bein adam lichaveiro is that of not taking revenge. Logically, it would make sense that if someone did something wrong to you, you have every right to do something wrong back to them. Therefore, right after instructing us to not take revenge, the pasuk says that we should treat others the way in which we want to be treated. Even though it may be very difficult to not harm a person after they have harmed us, we must remember the way in which we would want to be treated and act that way towards others.

This point also helps us understand the last two words of the pasuk. If we can understand that the reason we are treating others with respect is because that is what God asks of us, and that is the way He wants us to live, then it should not matter to us whether or not it seems fair. Even though it may make the most sense to take revenge and hurt those who have hurt you, we must trust that Hashem has a greater plan than what we can see, and therefore must treat others the same way that we would like to be treated.
